## **Melbourne Cup & Men vs Ladies**







Melbourne Cup day at Thirlstane is always an event that is looked forward to and an opportunity for the ladies to share the day with some of the men and guests.

### Repairing and/or Replacing Divots







Taking divots is a normal part of any round of golf. Making our best effort to repair our divots should also be a routine part of the game.

A little time spent properly repairing our divots make a big difference in how the course plays and sets a positive example for others.

Properly repairing divots helps the turf recover as quickly as possible.

If the divot is intact and there is soil still attached, simply replace it in the correct orientation and firmly press the divot into the ground with your foot. If there are any significant gaps between divot and the surrounding turf fill them with sand and smooth with your foot. This will help the turf knit back together.

If a divot does not have soil or is shattered into small pieces filling the hole with sand is the best option.

Making our best effort to repair divots is an easy way to care for the course and help others enjoy their round.

Take pride in your divot repair. Who knows, the divot you repair today could give you a better lie the next time around.
